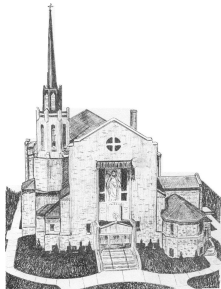

Family Ministry

The vision here is to develop a clean spaces for our nursery and children up to 4th grade, to determine when they will be in class verses in worship, to develop the curriculum that will be used, and to partner with others already doing the work, such as Lutherdale and Penfield.

Discipleship Path

Here we are challenged to provide clear serving on-ramps for service during the week and other times. We are to define what discipleship is and to develop a skills inventory to help people discern their spiritual giftedness. Our Wednesday Prayer Lunch is a clear “on-ramp” service opportunity here at OSLC.

The Heart of Milwaukee

Our goal is for the leadership to run point on developing the community partnerships like Neighborhood House, Central City Churches and others to be aligned with a single vision for the growth and future of this congregation. This includes relationships with the city, county and state governments to connect with the vision of becoming the Heart of MKE.

In addition to these efforts, we are simultaneously developing a Stewardship campaign that will help to fund these initiatives for our future. Read more about that on the next page. We need your help to realize the great results we are seeking in a revitalized ministry that will last another 160 years.

Drawing on its 159 years of rich history, Our Savior's Lutheran Church is pivoting to an exciting new vision of its future. Always a place of devout worship and service to the community, the congregation is now awakening to an essential and unique role that God is calling it to play in our community. Our Savior's looks to become not just a caring and steadfast observer of the future, but a robust and active builder of it – a church for the city – a church for the next generation.

The need is great.
The time is now.

The neighborhood we serve is on the cusp of resurgence. The City of Milwaukee is becoming increasingly attractive to young professionals who are looking for a deeper sense of purpose and greater engagement in the community. At the same time our neighborhood is home to many young families struggling with poverty and lack of opportunity.

At Our Savior's, we envision a future where these disparate communities will meld their unique cultures and strengths to create an even stronger Milwaukee. But that future depends on the presence of strong institutions that can bring them together in mutual understanding, support and understanding through faith. *We must be here for a resurgent community to build around.* Faith and a shared vision of a strong community can be the bridge that ends silos of division among Milwaukeeans. With God's guidance, we will reshape Our Savior's for this new role. *For such a time as this*, we will be a church for the city – a church for the next generation.

RENEW REJOICE! Stewardship Campaign 2017 kicks off this month - Increased gifts and offerings will be used to *sustain current day-to-day operations* of the congregation (\$170,000) so that we will be staffed and positioned to effectively carry out our work as a congregation.

All are invited to participate with increased offerings so that we have a strong and secure financial base. Your joyful participation will help us reach our goal of \$80,000 in *new gifts* in 2017. We will communicate with you by mail, temple talks and bulletin inserts throughout February, culminating with Commitment Sunday on March 5th. Plan to be present on Sunday, February 26th to hear our guest speaker, Kay Edwards, present the Siebert Foundation Millennial Study highlights that will help us learn what young professionals are seeking for their lives.

And so we begin! Ministry Initiatives for 2017

To assure that key strategies of our strategic plan become reality, Design Teams have been convened for each strategy to create new, exciting action plans. Resources will be needed to launch and implement the efforts of these Design Teams.

Goal 1: Sunday Morning Experience \$6,000

Evaluate and plan for all aspects of Sundays at Our Savior's.

- ◆ Update our worship space (including lighting and technology) and develop new and improved worship services that are engaging to a new generation. \$2000
- ◆ Develop Guest Services including new "welcome stations" for receiving visitors. Improve the space with cleaning, new signage, new furniture, printed materials and supplies that will help our guests' first impressions result in return visits that will lead to engagement in the life and ministries of the congregation. \$4000

Goal 2: Marketing and Communications \$3,000

Update, improve and increase our marketing and communications platform to better communicate to our members and our target audience - young millennials and young professional families.

- ◆ New website that is easily navigable with contemporary graphics and imagery, and the ability to provide video and podcasts of worship services. \$2000
- ◆ New church logo that speaks to who we are and what we value. A new logo that is modern and reflects the church's values is imperative. \$500
- ◆ New marketing collaterals to welcome, invite and communicate what is happening at Our Savior's, including a welcome brochure, updated bulletins and church newsletter formats, stationary and business cards that reflect a modern look and include our new logo and mission statement. \$500

Goal 3: Strengthen On-going Ministry \$1,000





Sustain current day-to-day operations with excellence as we strive to make up for \$49,000 in revenue lost in the last few years as faithful members have joined the saints in God's heavenly realm.

- ◆ Maintain the building for ongoing ministries of hospitality as we host church and community partner ministries, meetings, events and worship services. This campaign is raising funds (\$28,000) for a shared Facilities Manager position to help us oversee the care and maintenance of the church plant.
- ◆ Strengthen the organizational structure. Attention to leadership needs (both staff and volunteer), is vital for pivoting Our Savior's to fulfill its mission and vision for the future. We anticipate costs for research, training, and materials for this initiative of \$1000.

Gifts to the 2017 Renew Rejoice! Stewardship campaign will ensure a strong and secure financial base, alleviating dependence on the Foundation, and becoming sustainable into the future.

From the Archive Team Faith Stories
OSLC MEMORIES FROM THELMA THIELSEN

My father came to America from Norway, became a pastor and married my mother in Dows, Iowa. He served Lutheran churches in Iowa and South Dakota. I was born in 1922 in the parsonage in Moe, SD, the 4th in a family of 8 children. His last call was in Parkside, Saskatchewan Canada.



I attended school in various places and after high school graduation traveled to Chicago, where my sister was a nurse. There I became a nurse through the Cadet Nurse Corp, started during WW II. After the war I met and married my husband, Elmer. We moved to Milwaukee with three children, Janet, Gary and Greg; there he started a new job. We attended a few churches that summer, but knew one family who attended Our Savior's. That was George and Alma Johnson, parents to Ardith Strommen. They were from the same Iowa town as my mother. We joined Our Savior's. It was the right thing to do.


Soon Elmer became an usher in 1956 and we met many wonderful couples who became our lifelong friends. We had two more children, Steven and David. They all attended Sunday School, confirmation classes, youth choir, Bible camp, choir trips, college trips and played on the baseball team. Being a downtown church they met friends living in various parts of the city. Elmer served on the Church Council and Building and Grounds Committee. I was busy with the children and appreciated the baby cry room behind the balcony where I met other mothers. Eventually I joined the Mothers Circle for Bible study and friendship. This later became Leah Circle with 25 plus members.

Quilting for Lutheran World Relief was a big part of my life, where quilts were made in Fellowship Hall with many good sewers and shipped out to where needed, through LWR. Salt and Pepper Club for married couples brought many happy get-togethers for Elmer and me. Best memories were Christmas services, Easter Sunrise Service and being part of the kitchen workers, our friends. The people made it special.
