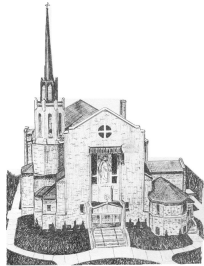

FROM PASTOR BARBARA:

During the Lenten season, the 40 days from Ash Wednesday through Palm Sunday, we are asked to spend more time looking deeply at how we turn toward God than we do during the rest of the year. We are called to spend forty days in the wilderness -- away from distractions -- things that distract us from our relationship with God. There are a number of ways we do this.

On an individual basis we can spend more time in daily devotion, meditation and prayer. On the congregational level we worship more frequently -- adding a Wednesday evening service. Our Sunday worship takes on a more penitential form, with no alleluias and more somber hymns for the most part. We include confession in each service.

To assist us in our more reverent journey, we consider "giving up something for Lent." I have discovered over the years that the sacrifice of Lent is more meaningful if it benefits someone else. One way we can do this is to set aside an amount of money each day as part of our Lenten devotional act, and give that dollar amount to those who need it most.

Outreach for Hope (OFH) is a mission that encourages us to support congregations doing ministry with people in poverty. This year Jim Bickel, Director of OFH, is seeking 40 congregations that will find 40 families or individuals who will give \$1.00 a day for 40 days to this cause.

You can be one of those families by picking up a special offering box decorated by the youth of our parish. Along with the box for your dollar a day, you will receive a Lenten devotional book written by Venice Williams, Associate in Ministry, of our Greater Milwaukee Synod. These tools can help us on our spiritual journey through Lent.

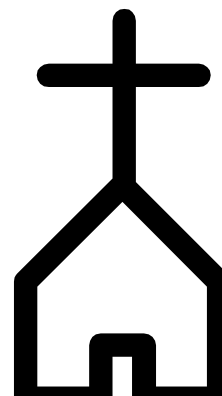
You can enhance your Lenten journey by joining the Sunday morning forum between services "Living the Gospel for Peace", beginning at 9:50 each week from March 13 through April 17. The sessions will be led by the Multicultural Ministry Team members who have received training from the Kaleidoscope Institute. Please notify the Church Office of your intent to participate, and please plan to do so for the entire course.

Our midweek services, as has been the case for many years, will be held at Central United Methodist Church on Wednesdays, beginning with a soup supper at 6:00 pm. The service is at 6:45. This year's theme is "Answering the Call." Four congregations on the Avenue each have responsibility for one evening, and one week will be shared by all. Our Savior's is hosting the supper and service on April 13. You can help by signing up to make soup or help to serve and clean up. March 30 will be the shared service. Our 3AM musicians will lead the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy on March 30 and April 13. I will be sharing the message along with other pastors.

Ash Wednesday services will be held in each of the congregations on March 9. The service at Our Savior's will include another penitential rite, that of imposition of ashes. In this act we recognize that we are human, and our time on this earth is finite, yet we are connected to all of God's creation as physical beings.

Please begin to plan your Lenten journey and join us in worship, study and prayer whenever possible.

Dear Brothers and Sisters;

We are approaching the season of Lent, a time of repentance and a reminder of our profound sin and mortality and a season that walks us all the way to a cross which we recognize is the place where we crucified the Son of God.

The traditional purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer — through prayer, penitence, almsgiving and self-denial.

During Lent we have two invitations that will help us to celebrate Lent in a meaningful way. The first one is the invitation sent by Outreach for Hope. They invite 40 churches, which will invite 40 members to pray for forty days and give one dollar a day. The goal is to raise as much as we can to help Outreach for Hope to give grants to those churches that work with people who live in poverty. If you are willing to participate you can contact Paul Brynildson or the church office to receive a collection box. Outreach for Hope has provided funding to Our Savior's for the Wednesday Prayer Service and Lunch ministry, allowing us to purchase some of the food and also to pay a musician to help lead the service.



The other invitation is from the Kaleidoscope team. They are inviting you to be part of the study and learn from the "Living the Gospel for Peace." This group study will have six sessions and each one of the members of the Kaleidoscope team will lead a session.

This study will help us to learn new ways to relate and respect each other no matter what age, race, language, culture or sexual orientation we are. The Gospel of peace will teach us how to communicate with each other in a very respectful way. It also teaches us to listen to each other and the most important thing, "Living the Gospel for Peace" will help us to know ourselves. By knowing why we do what we do, we develop a better understanding of why others "do what they do." We can learn to leave behind our assumptions, which create for the most part some misunderstandings and problems.

This group study will be a good way to prepare us during this time of lent. It will help us to be transformed from inside out to live the Gospel for Peace wherever we are. You are invited to be part of this wonderful opportunity Sunday mornings in Lent, March 13 - April 17. Come and join us and bring a friend!

DOLLAR A DAY FOR POVERTY

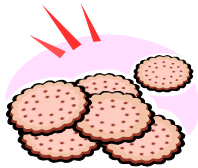
Brothers and sisters, you are cordially invited to join me in participating in the Outreach for Hope “Dollar a Day for Poverty” program as part of your personal Lenten discipline beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 9. Our Savior’s is one of 22 Outreach for Hope churches within the Greater Milwaukee Synod for the 2011 program year. We have agreed to participate as a visible way of lifting up the importance of the Outreach for Hope (OFH) ministry within the Greater Milwaukee Synod.

You might be asking, “just what is the purpose of Outreach for Hope and how is it visible at Our Savior’s?”. OFH began in 1995 as a Greater Milwaukee Synod ministry to strengthen financial support for congregation-based ministries among the poor. It seeks to connect financial gifts of generous people with caring congregations serving the poor within our synod, located in the urban areas of Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha. Synod congregations and ministries, serving central city neighborhoods, who have made a commitment to remain a strong source of spiritual and community support among the poor, are eligible for grants. Our Savior’s is a current recipient of an OFH grant that provides funding for our Wednesday Prayer lunches for food and worship/outreach support. Down Wisconsin Avenue, both St. Paul’s and Redeemer serve as OFH churches using grant money for programming among the poor tailored to the unique gifts and circumstances of each of those sister congregations.

OFH “A Dollar a Day for Poverty” program is offered to us as a Lenten discipline for all synod congregations and households who are willing to participate. They are asking for at least 40 congregations to secure at least 40 households who can give a dollar a day for the 40 days of Lent. While the number of households and the goal of a dollar a day are suggested targets, OFH will accept whatever donations that come in.

Participants will receive a collection of daily Lenten devotions that highlight the current ministries of OFH and opportunities to walk with the poor this Lent. We are blessed to have the gifts and talents of Venice Williams who authored these Lenten devotions as “40 Reflections Looking Out Onto the Soul of the City”. Participants will also receive a donation bank to collect offerings toward the \$1 a day goal.

Recently, some members of your church council attended the annual Synod Leadership Event where we were encouraged to become better transformational leaders as we envision, plan, and participate in all of our church’s diverse ministerial opportunities. This Lent, consider for OSLC and for you, how will we “Answer the Call”?

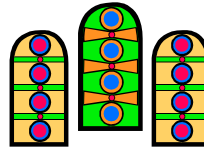

**REMEMBER
THE POOR**

From Bishop Jeff Barrow, "Remember the poor"

In a message on the Greater Milwaukee Synod Listserve last month, Bishop Jeff responded to the situation in Madison by planning a visit to the state capitol on Friday, February 25 and inviting synod members, lay and clergy, Republican and Democrat, to join him. He reminded us, "the Bible continually urges us to consider the poor (Ex.23:6, Psalm113:7, Mt.5:3, Mk.10:21, Mk.12:42, Ja.2:5 plus countless other passages). Whatever else happens with the Wisconsin state budget, I have deep concerns that the poor in the state will suffer most when all is said and done...The thing that I have always appreciated most about the Greater Milwaukee Synod is that, amid whatever else has divided us, our commitment to walk with the poor has often united us."
