

from the Kaleidoscope Team - by Penny Schwid

The next round of Kaleidoscope Bible Study (KBS) is being planned. Four or five groups will begin meeting

in August. Be prepared to say "yes", "pass for now" or "pass" when you are invited to join a KBS.

Why are we so excited about getting everyone involved in Kaleidoscope Bible Study? Because we have noticed that it is making a difference in our lives. Alicia Ellis puts it this way, "It's an exciting adventure. It has given me good steps to Bible reading and understanding and let's me know that my interpretation is OK; my interpretation is not wrong."

The KBS model is grounded in the RESPECTful communication guidelines (see April and May Messengers) and also the communication tool called Mutual Invitation (see June Messenger). These tools enable us to come to the Bible as equals; not one of us has THE right answer and all of our experiences are valid in interpreting and understanding of scripture for our lives. We can bring our own culture, heritage, communication style, and life experiences to the table and participate fully. We speak only for ourselves as we find meaning for our own lives. We can choose to speak, to pass or pass for now.

The Bible offers us a wide range of examples of people and their experiences. Some of the stories are repeated by several authors, giving us different perspectives of the same event. The Gospels offer us 4 different perspectives on the life and ministry of Jesus. By reading all 4 Gospels, we "capture a dynamic living relationship with Christ now in our own context...Each time we read a biblical text, we cross into the culture embedded in the text, the cultural context of the different groups and persons in the story, and the cultural context of the writer...the Bible invites us to bring our own cultural context to the crossing so that we can encounter God anew".*

So, when we read Scripture together in a diverse community, we build an inclusive community. We do not rely on an expert Bible scholar to tell us what the text means. Rather we study the scripture with people of diverse experiences, hearing different interpretations based on the different contexts of the participants. "By listening to each other, we value the diversity that exists among us and receive our differences as gifts that provide a fuller vision of ourselves and our ministry."*



Stewardship: Where did the tithe go?

Last month I mentioned an experience that Pastor Barbara and I had as we took a shuttle back to the Nashville airport. Taking a clue from a sign over the driver's head couraging passengers to tip it read: It is not against company policy to tip the driver. I suggested a sign over the church door that might read: It is not against church policy to tithe. Hmm:-)

Earlier last month while visiting New York City and then later while in Door County, I learned that a tithe is no longer appropriate for table service. At the bottom of our food check printed just below the total were suggested tip amounts:

15% tip followed by an amount equal to fifteen percent of our check

20% tip followed by an amount equal to twenty percent of our check.

25% tip followed by an amount equal to twenty-five percent of our check.

Apparently 10%, that is a tithe, as a tip is just too low to even consider. Hmm. :-)

This, of course, got me to thinking. Certainly our offering is not tipping God for God's services. Rather, it represents our joyful and generous response to the bounteous gifts God freely gives to us daily. If this is so, then why is it that the typical Lutheran (whoever that is?) returns only 1.9% of his/her income to God's church?

Just thinking out loud.
